Meeting the Secretary of State for Northern Ireland, Hilary Benn - January 2025

David Johnstone officially took up his post as the Northern Ireland Veterans Commissioner on 6 January 2025. He brings with him an impressive 26-year career in military service (Reserves) and a wealth of leadership experience gained not only from his military background but also from his time in semi-professional football and business management.

Appointed by the Secretary of State for Northern Ireland on 18 December 2024, David's unique background positions him as a strong advocate for veterans across the region.

David's military journey began in 1988 with the Royal Irish Rangers (Reserve), leading to his commissioning from Sandhurst in 1991. Rising to the rank of Major, his distinguished career included pivotal service in Iraq during Operation Telic 4 in 2004, where he served as second in command of his company in Basra. Known for his adaptability, David's military timeline reflects both tradition and modernity—spanning the era of the SLR rifle to more recent operations.

After leaving the Army Reserves in 2014, David focused on a successful career in property consultancy, where he facilitated developer funding and fostered relationships with investors. Beyond his professional life, David is deeply involved in football, serving as General Manager and Youth Development Manager for a local Irish League club, blending his passion for the game with community engagement.

As Veterans Commissioner, David is dedicated to strengthening the support system for Northern Ireland's veteran community. With plans to enhance communication through initiatives such as podcasts, he aims to preserve and share veteran stories for future generations. He is committed to improving accessibility and collaboration across veteran services while ensuring Northern Ireland's veterans are represented at the national level.

David's combination of military, professional, and community leadership ensures a capable and passionate advocate for veterans, ready to build upon the office's success and address the needs of the veteran community across Northern Ireland.

This appointment marks a significant step forward in ensuring that Northern Ireland's veterans' needs are heard and addressed within the broader UK strategy.

Veterans Honoured at Special Remembrance Event at Windsor Park

On Saturday, 9th November 2024, the Northern Ireland Veterans Commissioner's Office (NIVCO), in partnership with Linfield Football Club, hosted a heartfelt Remembrance event at Windsor Park, welcoming 100 veterans for a day of gratitude, reflection, and community.

Sport globally serves as a powerful mechanism to bring people together, and Linfield FC exemplifies this by holding an act of remembrance each year. This year, in collaboration with NIVCO, the event focused on recognising the service of veterans, both young and old.

The day began with an inspiring talk and Q&A session led by David Jeffrey MBE, former footballer and manager, followed by a meal and hospitality ahead of the match between Linfield and Ballymena United.

A highlight of the event was the special pitch-side act of remembrance, a moving tribute to the courage and sacrifice of those who have served. This moment brought together different generations of veterans, united by a shared love of football and a deep connection to service.

Regardless of which team veterans were cheering for, the opportunity to come together, be recognised, and enjoy a unique day out was warmly welcomed by all who attended.

The recipients of the **Veteran Owned Business of the Year Award** were also recognised, highlighting outstanding businesses led by veterans. This year's winner is **Gentem**, whose dedication and innovation set a high standard in their industry.





This year's **Lifetime Achievement Award** saw an exceptionally high standard of candidates, reflecting the incredible dedication of many remarkable individuals. The award goes to **Alan McDade**, sponsored by G4S UK and presented by Kevin Scurby.

A special moment of the evening was the presentation of the first **Channing Day Inspiration of the Year Award**, named in memory of Cpl Channing Day, who made the ultimate sacrifice in Afghanistan. Channing, from Comber, Co. Down, served in the Royal Army Medical Corps as a Combat Medic, died on 24 October 2012 aged 25 yrs, and was one of three female soldiers killed in action during Op Herrick. This very special award celebrates her legacy, courage, and dedication and reminds us of a young life lost too soon.

The recipient of this years award is **Brian McKee**, presented by Channing's mother, Rosemary Day, alongside Head of Office from the Veterans Commissioner's office, Alan Murphy.
